INTRODUCING PILGRIM'S NEW VICAR, JOHN SCHULTZ

Q: Tell us about your personal and professional background.

A: I grew up the son of Ed and Julie Schultz. My dad was the grandson of William Matthes who was a pastor in Milwaukee, WI. We moved 14 times when I was a child.



I attended Lutheran schools my entire elementary and high school life. I graduated from 8th grade at Northwest Lutheran School in Milwaukee in 1968. I attended High School at Concordia Lutheran High for three years and graduated from Milwaukee Lutheran High in 1972. I graduated from Concordia St. Paul, MN with Elementary Education and K-12 Physical Education degrees 1976.

I student taught at St. John's Lutheran in Merrill, WI. I married Ruth Ellen Burger in 1976. We received dual calls to St. Paul Lutheran Church and School in Janesville, WI and taught for 17 years there. I was a teacher, coach and vice principal there. I graduated from the University of Wisconsin Whitewater in 1980 with a Master's degree in Education and Professional Development (MEPD). We had three children Jeremy (JJ), Rachel, and Sarah in Janesville.

We were called to St. John's Lutheran Church and School in Adrian, Michigan in 1994. We served there for three years. I was the principal, teacher, Athletic Director, and Music Director as well as serving the church who was without a pastor for six months.

We were called to Evansville Lutheran School in Evansville, Indiana in 1997 and served for nine years. I was the full-time principal there. It was an association of one school in two buildings operated by 3 churches who had four pastors and five additional congregations who sent children to our school.

I got my second Master's degree in Administration from Concordia University Wisconsin in 2005 while I served there. JJ and I graduated on the same day, while he got his Bachelors and I got my Masters.

We were called to Trinity Lutheran Church and School in Crown Point, Indiana in 2006. We served there for nine years. Then 2015, I was called to be principal at Pilgrim in Green Bay, WI. I served for seven years at Pilgrim.

We have four grandchildren. Hayden attends NEWLHS as a freshman. Isabella is a sixth grader, Emmett is in second grade, and Micah is in first grade at Pilgrim Lutheran School. God has truly blessed our ministry for 45 years.

Q: How did you come to the decision that you would like to move into the vicar position?

A: Pilgrim has almost 2800 members and only two pastors. Since I have had many opportunities to serve churches over 45 years, I believe the Lord has prepared and called me to serve part time with this fantastic team of pastors who serve this awesome congregation.

Q: What has been the process to train to be a vicar?

A: I began by filling out a form which detailed my ministry, schooling, who I learned from, and how have I served the church. It ended up being 17 pages. I filled out two additional forms regarding our church's needs and my doctrinal position. The seminary had to receive a letter of approval from our Pilgrim Pastors Malme and Hanson. Pastor Hanson volunteered to be my mentor/supervisor for this program. Ruth and I had to conduct an interview in Wausau at the North Wisconsin District (NWD) office with a committee to both be approved for me to enter the Specific Ministry Program (SMP). I had to be approved by our NWD President Lueck who then wrote a letter of acceptance to Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, MO. When this was completed, I had to pass three tests of 100 questions each in 75 minutes in the areas of the Old Testament, New Testament, and Lutheran Doctrine. I have had four additional documents to fill out and have attended an orientation in St. Louis at the Seminary in February with my mentor Pastor Hanson. I have 16 classes to complete over four years. Classes began at the end of February and are 12 weeks each. There are four classes to attend in St. Louis at the Seminary over the course of four years, which means I will be a vicar longer than any other vicar Pilgrim has ever had. After the completion of nine classes, I will be ordained and certified to serve as pastor at Pilgrim. I will still need to complete seven additional classes. Upon completion of the classes I will be finished with the SMP program. I can only be called into ministry at Pilgrim Lutheran Church, hence the term specific ministry. I am planning on serving part time. I thank the Lord and Pilgrim for giving me this opportunity to continue to serve!

Q: What will your role at Pilgrim be?

A: I will serve by preaching, teaching, visiting shut-ins, making hospital calls, and, once ordained, baptizing, consecrating the elements, marrying, conducting funerals and in any other capacity to assist our pastors and congregation.

Wow! We had a terrific turnout for our first Lenten suppers - please join us at an upcoming one!

Grief by Pilgrim member Maureen Seyferth

Grief is a word you hear used when a person goes to heaven, but you really don't know what this grief is all about unless you experienced a loss of someone you loved. You can even have grief over the loss of a pet...not to compare a pet to a human, but we hold our pets right up there with being a "member of the family". We use phrases with grief, "Good grief Charlie Brown!" or "He gave me grief about typos." or "Many a ship has come to grief along this shore.". The grief I am writing about its definition: deep sorrow and pain, especially that is caused by someone's death. For those of who haven't experienced this loss you may think that definition is all there is. For someone who has experienced the loss of a loved one, you learn very fast that there are so many parts to grief. The five stages of grief:

- Denial-you may have difficulty accepting that a loss is real. For awhile I used to think Larry was on a sales trip and he'll be home soon.
- Anger-angry at multiple sources, God, people who couldn't save your person, or no one in particular. I was angry at Mayo Clinic because I felt they 'dropped the ball' in their care for Larry.
- Bargaining-you may regret past actions that you imagine could've spared you from loss. I thought that I could have/should have done something to save Larry.
- Depression- emotional detachment. Feeling like the sun will never shine. I didn't think I would laugh or smile again.
- Acceptance-eventually you embrace the reality of loss even if the pain's still there. Larry isn't coming back from a sales trip.

These stages were developed by Dr. Elisabeth Kubler-Ross as she observed people who were terminally ill and the emotions of the dying. This became a way to strategize grief. This interpretation suggested that there is a 'right way' and a 'wrong way' to grieve. You must go thru these stages to be healed. Getting out of grief is the goal. You have to do it correctly and you have to do it fast. If you don't progress correctly, you are failing at grief. In her later years, Ms. Ross wrote that she regretted writing the stages as she did, that people mistook them as being both linear and universal. The stages of grief were not meant to tell anyone what to feel and when exactly they should feel it. They were not meant to tell you if you are doing your grief correctly or not. Her stages were meant to give comfort, not create a cage.

There are no stages of grief! You can't force an order on pain. You can't make grief tidy and predictable. To do grief well is dependent on the individual. It means listening to your own reality. You might experience many of the things other grievers experience and hearing that may bring you comfort. But comparing one way of living with loss with another as if though it was a pass-fail endeavor? That is never going to help. A great point to remember (which for some reason I don't always remember, but am working on this) is to thank God for giving you that person to love. Such an uplifting thought!

STEPHEN MINISTERS: THE “AFTER” PEOPLE

Have you ever wondered what Stephen Ministers do? You may have heard that they provide confidential care to individuals going through a tough time, but what does that mean?

Stephen Ministers are sometimes referred to as the "After People" because we are there:

....after the funeral is over, and others have moved on with their lives,
....after the divorce papers are served and the bottom falls out of your life,
....after the doctor gives a serious diagnosis to you or your loved one,
....after you've lost your job,
....or a loved one is incarcerated,
....or you feel like your family and friends have heard whatever your painful experience is one too many times, but you still feel the need to talk about it.

What we actually do varies with each caring relationship based on the individual's needs, but Stephen Ministers are specially trained to be wholly present with the person to listen, pray, help search scriptures for guidance, explore their feelings, and share Christ's love which can bring hope and His peace back into their lives.

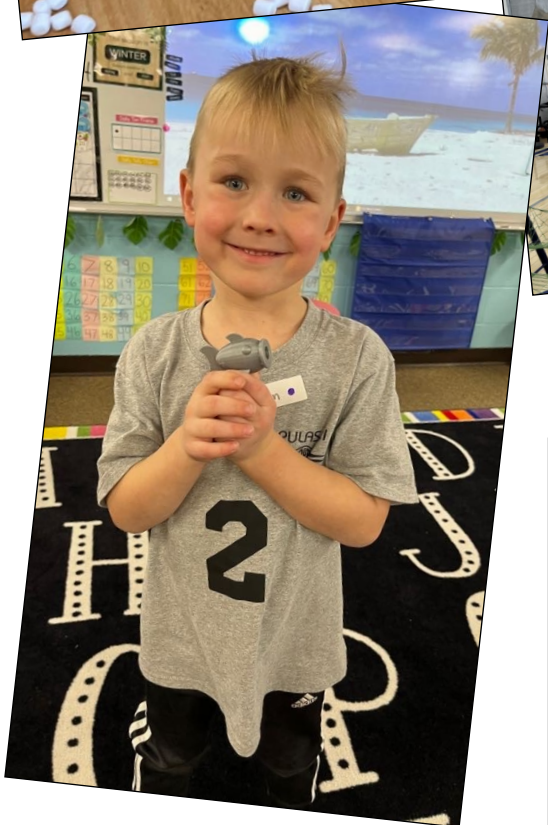
